- 2. Approval of COMPASS minutes for February 15, 2017 meeting. (not immediately available) tabled to next meeting
- 3. COMPASS and Technology Related Issues.
 - a. Questions or issues with Horizon functions.

Windows 10 takes lots of memory to start up, so logging into Horizon the first time each day will be slow.

- b. Horizon news: updates, upgrades, etc.
 - i. Upcoming Horizon releases (7.5.4 and 7.5.4.1) & HIP releases (3.24.1). verson 7.5.4 is stable, will roll out in June. Email notifications will be automatic. Version 4.1 is for family cards, It will be out $2^{\rm nd}$ quarter. Family cards will be staff use only.

Version 5.5 will be out during the last quarter. It includes blue cloud commerce. 5.6 will be released late '18 includes merging patron records.

ii. SMS messaging: implementation: update.

Robert working on implementing text message notifications. Automatic trigger at day end, but runs in am. Consensus of group is to count as notice. Will not receive email with same info. Working with S-D on refining procedures.

iii. Possible wording changes for notices and messages + possible Privacy issues Consensus is to eliminate titles on notices, add something about protecting privacy, add "do not reply" statement.

iv. bstats for tracking statistics: more than one bstat per person?

Could do age classes if specific bstats are added. Discussion about desirability of collecting more statistics. **No interest at this point in adding bstats**.

v. BLUEcloud circulation.

Released, but not ready yet. Can't add patron info. Chris can set up if desired.

- vi. Enterprise & eResource Central (ERC) interfaces: update.
 - 1. Time-line for updates.(Chad passed out paper timeline)
 - a. 4.1 is a security upgrade late April or early May
 - b. Nothing required on libraries' parts

Chris working on handouts for cataloging fixed fields, ie. format fields.

vii. Other BLUEcloud news.

Analytics changes - good reports -

Bookmyne won't be updated because bluecloud mobile is being developed. It is a Full mobile app. It can push notifications, It will be staged releases in 3rd or 4th quarter. Can be branded. Sirsi is Looking at developing kids' interface also. BlueCloud Acquisitions – pilot in 2018 should be easier to use Digital Academy – includes links to online classes for all age groups. Library Connections video shown (available for posting – also on youtube)

c. MnLINK migration and OCLC record "reclamation."

Chris and Mollie will do site visits for inventory. Finish all inventory by October 1, Email Mollie to schedule. Ipad kits are being reserved, so book those too.

Minimal catalog standards – Chris developing handouts for fixing records.

Will be submitting to OCLC in November.

d. Non-resident borrower's cards: the volunteer committee met on March 2. Minutes will be forthcoming. Committee will probably need to meet again. Trying to develop consistency. Discussions are happening at other regions also.

Possible youth pass for electronic resources? Could have another prefix for the region just for electronics. St Paul public is testing model with schools. Minitex is exploring.

- e. Current balance of ALS materials budget for OverDrive: approx. \$51,304 as of 4/1/17 (does not include an additional \$17,427 being provided by member libraries).

so if power goes off, there is still filtering.

Ely – Has opportunity to purchase neighboring property, and city is exploring options. Doing children's programs

Cook– Has new website, Friends are registering for 501 c 3 designation. Spring pig has appeared (hiding every day and finder gets prize each day) Library will open on Saturdays in summer. **Hibbing** updating children's room, mostly painted now. New chairs.

Virgina book sale next week. Hiring new clerk.

Grand Marais, strategic planning process postponed until fall. They will use Whitney Crettol Writers conference is 1st weekend in nov.
